Defining the Report Scope

This report measures the primary and secondary impact of health care jobs and income for Crow Wing County.

The health care sector includes five components:

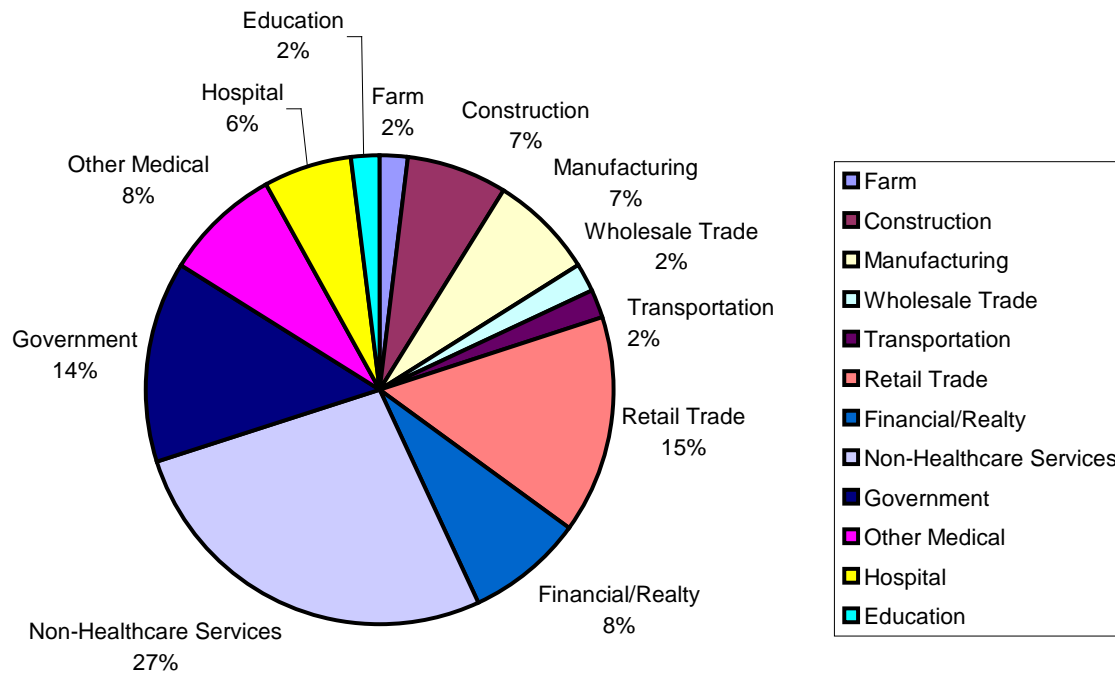
- Hospitals
- Doctors and dentists (includes chiropractors, optometrists)
- Nursing and protective care (nursing and group homes)
- Other medical and health services (includes home health care, veterinarians, rehabilitation and the county health departments)
- Pharmacies

The report applies a multiplier calculation in an attempt to measure the full economic impact of the health care sector in Crow Wing County. Multipliers are calculated for the county and are unique to each component of the sector.



Employment

Total employment in Crow Wing County was 33,179 in 2011 and health care services accounted for 14 percent

Financial Linkages

- Ten new jobs in the health care sector creates four non-health care jobs
- \$100 of income earned in the health sector leads to another \$30 earned in other sectors.
- One dollar spent on health care, leads to another \$.50 spent in other sectors.
- The overall economic impact of health care in Crow Wing County is estimated at **\$662.3 million.**
